Sporting Achievements


We are very proud of our team of Year 4 children, who represented Harris at the Multi-skills tournament this week and coming in 3rd place out of 12 Preston schools.

This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1



This week in Preschool, we have been looking at signs of Autumn. The children have been on walks around the school grounds, looking for any signs of Autumn and collecting any interesting items. We introduced our Autumn interest table where the children could take a closer look at some of the things we associate with the season, which provided lots of opportunity for sharing and learning new vocabulary. To enhance our Autumn learning further we enjoyed our book of the week 'The Leaf Thief'.



The children have been working hard in Phonics this week, learning their new sounds and using their phonic fingers to segment and blend a sentence. In Literacy, the children have been choosing their favourite things and talking about their initial sounds. The children have been drawing their selfportraits, remembering the skills they have learnt over the past few weeks. In our Understanding the World lessons, we have been looking at the equipment people need for different jobs. We even had Doctor Keens visit us to talk to us about her job and she made a clinic so we could bring in our 'poorly' teddies!



Year 1 have been working really hard this week. In English, the children wrote their final story and I know lots of them were excited for their parents to read. In Maths, we have been learning our number bonds to 10. In Science, we looked at animal poo to learn about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. In History, we made timelines and played a quiz about the explorers we've learnt. In Geography, we scanned QR codes to learn about penguin homes. Mr Ridge said the children were brilliant in PE this week! Well done Year 1.

PIC+COLLAGE



This week in maths, we have continued to work on adding and subtracting two-digit numbers. In English, we have started to write our stories, inspired by the Jolly Postman. In Science, we have been learning about germination and the different parts of seeds. We learnt about the Lancashire cotton mills in history and wrote a diary entry for one of the children in the textile mills. We got very messy and creative in Art on Wednesday, annotating LS Lowry's work and practising some of his techniques using charcoal and oil pastels.

This week in Key Stage 2



In English, we have been busy writing a letter of complaint to the council using persuasive writing linked to our text: The Tin Forest. In Science, we have been investigating light and how we see things. The children were fascinated by seeing their pupils grow. The pupils grew bigger in the dark to allow more light to enter the eye and the pupils got smaller in bright light. In Computing, we have been having fun creating our own Interactive Comics on iPads using the app: Book Creator.



In English the children have been applying what we have learnt this term by writing a fairy tale and a newspaper report independently. In Maths the children have excelled in statistics and data handling. We have come to the end of our French unit on animals and our music unit on Abba and Mama Mia. We have also finished our Ancient Civilization topic in History and have enjoyed learning about their religions as well as learning about their housing by building models. Next week, Mrs Vaughan-Dyke will be attending the Year 6 residential trip so will not be present in school. The teacher for next week will be Miss Laly.



In English this week we have begun to look at persuasive writing and gathering information on the different techniques used to persuade. We have analysed different texts and begun to create a toolkit which we will use to write our final outcome. We are linking this to our history and computing topics in order to create a persuasive news report. We have been busy looking into angles in maths - it has been challenging using a protractor accurately! In science, we have continued to investigate forces, this week focussing on friction.



After reading and digesting the style of the novel The Nowhere Emporium, Year 6 celebrated by writing our own magical story based on the story. In Maths, we worked with calculations that require counting on or back mentally and bridging efficiently. In Science, we worked scientifically by investigating the relationship between the length of shadows and the distance and angle of the light source. We got into character as evacuees in our History lesson and interviewed each other to see if our experiences in the countryside were good or bad. What a great week of learning!


