This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1



It was lovely to welcome the children back into Preschool after the Christmas break. This week we have shared the story 'How Big is a Million?' about a young penguin named Pipkin, who struggles to understand just how big a million is, helping us to understand the concept of large numbers. We have looked at how Emperor Penguins look after their eggs and watched them hatch. We even had a go at being a penguin ourselves, transporting our 'egg' between our ankles across the outdoor area.



The children have settled back into our routines well and are eager to learn! In Literacy, we have been reading Lost & Found and learning lots of new vocabulary. The children have created 'Lost!' posters and have written descriptions of their missing animal. In Maths, we have been comparing two sets of objects by using 'more, less and equal'. We have been looking at our local environment and comparing it to other environments around the world. In PSED, we have been looking at how to keep ourselves safe, starting with what we use to keep our bodies safe - suncream, plasters, soap, etc. Our new Phonics sounds for this week: j v w. Our new tricky words: he she



It has been a lovely first week and the children have settled back into school. In English, we have started reading our new traditional tale called Diamonds and Pearls. In Maths, we have been learning about the days of the week and months of the year. We also enjoyed timing ourselves doing lots of fun challenges in seconds and minutes. In Science, we have completed indoor and outdoor activities learning about Winter and recording the temperatures this week. We also took photos of deciduous and evergreen trees around school. In Geography, we have begun learning about the United Kingdom and this week we focused on England, London and landmarks.



In English, we read The Man on the Moon, sequenced the story and wrote some fantastic diary entries, writing in role as Bob the astronaut, about their exciting day on the moon. We also learnt how to use subordinating conjunctions and using commas in lists. In maths, we have been revising place value and how to round numbers to the nearest 10, also solving problems that involved ordering different weights and heights. In PSHE, we discussed what we do to make us feel better when we are ill and how we can use medicines safely. In our history topic about space explorers, we learnt about how our solar system works and the children made models of the Earth, moon and sun.

This week in Key Stage 2



What a wonderful first week back we have had in Year 3 - the children have settled back into their routines brilliantly. They made a plant based vegetarian soup that was cooked on the hob. The skills that Y3 used included basic hygiene, food safety, chopping, peeling, and starting to use the hob (with supervision). In English we read the beginning of our book 'Stig of the dump' and explored the vocabulary. They came up with lots of descriptive sentences to describe the objects found in the dump. In French we have started to learn the colours and in History we've been busy exploring artefacts from the Stone Age period. Well done Year 3!



Welcome back! We've hit the ground running starting our English lessons with the story Balaclava Boys - see if they can retell it to you. In Maths we have been recapping and extending Place Value looking at decimals. We have started off DT by designing a bag, continued counting in French and started to learn our new rap - Stop! We've even managed to squeeze in a special Friday treat for winning the Green Orb Award last half term. Don't forget your material to make a bag with on Monday.



This week seems to have flown by and the children have settled back into their routines brilliantly. We have begun to explore our new literacy topic of Stories with Historical Settings and have been focussing on vocabulary used and generating questions about or text, Oliver Twist. We have also had an introduction to our science topic and had a fun lesson identifying materials and objects with a 'feely bag'. Well done, Year 5 - a great start to 2024!



What a great start to the new year we have had in Year 6! We kicked off our English lessons by researching facts about the cruel tradition some countries have of making bears 'dance' in order to help us write our biased arguments. In Maths, we used mental and written methods to help us solve time and timetable problems and we also played TT Rockstars to help us with our Times Tables. In Science, we looked at how animals have adapted themselves by making changes over time to better survive their environment. We were also visited by some pupils from Broughton High who kindly shared their knowledge of how to stay safe online.
