This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1

PRESCHOOL



This week in Preschool we have focussed on numbers. Reciting numbers to five and beyond, learning to recognise numerals and match them to quantities of up to five objects. Some children have even been subitising up to three objects! Outdoors the children have really enjoyed our newly delivered sand, giving opportunity to talk about quantities full, half full, empty, during play. As well as using imagination to create seaside and desert island scenes.

Thursday the 7th of March is World Book Day! Along with the rest of the school, Preschool are invited to dress up as their favourite character from a book.

Reception




This week in Phonics, we have been learning two new sounds: 'ai' and 'ee'. The children have been working so hard to understand these digraphs, as well as our new tricky words 'her' and 'all'. In Literacy, we have read The Enormous Turnip. We stepped through a magic mirror which turned us into the old man and discussed his feelings throughout the story. In Maths, we looked at partitioning numbers, firstly up to 5 and then we looked at greater numbers, using the part-whole method. In Understanding the World, we have planted our own vegetables which will be ready to bring home in a few weeks time. In PE, we have focused on different ways of travelling such as hopping, skipping, sliding and jumping.

We have been working really hard this week in Year 1. It was lovely to share the children's books with some of you this week. In English, we have been answering questions about special events. We also wrote party invitations using capital letters for names, days, months and places. In Maths, we have been measuring length using ten rods and many of us started to use rulers. In Science, we have been describing properties of lots of materials. We also enjoyed the Mad Science assembly. In History, we learnt about outdoor games from the past and the children loved playing these. We also started designing our own robots to help us with a job. Well done Year 1.




In English, we focused on the use of adjectives to create fantastic descriptions of Toad Hall and the Wild Wood from The Wind in the Willows. In maths, we practised exchanging tens and ones to add and subtract 2-digit numbers. In Science, we learnt how to identify things that are living or not, as well as things that have never been alive. In Geography, Year 2 worked in groups to create weather forecasts and did a fantastic job of using the UK map in their presentation- well done Year 2! In French, we practised the names for musical instruments and sorted them by their determiner: le, la and les.

This week in Key Stage 2



Year 3 have had a busy week this week. In Science, we have been investigating friction. The children enjoyed rolling cars down the ramps and investigating which surface allowed the car to travel the furthest. In Maths, they mastered division by using a vertical number line. In Computing, we explored the iMovie app and planned out our 'Iron Man' movie on paper. Next week we will be using the app to create it. Well done Year 3!



We have started our new book, Gulliver's Travels, this week after focusing on the assembly the week before. Wasn't it fantastic?! Great acting and performing from the class who wrote the script themselves. In Maths we have been adding and subtracting mentally with number line jottings. We've completed lots of work on our Geography topic - Italy this week, looking at modern day Italy after the work they have previously done on Romans. They should now be able to give the continent, say the countries around Italy, name the mountains, a lake and a river as well as some human landmarks.



In English we have been focussing more on our text, Journey to the River Sea and the children have worked really hard writing descriptions and using complex sentences. We have begun to look at our computing unit and have been familiarising ourselves with the program 'Scratch'. We will be creating some fabulous quizzes with our skills over the coming weeks. The children have also been practising their map skills in geography using globes and atlases to identify rainforests.





We were visited by magistrates on Tuesday, who came to tell us about the justice system, and we held a mock trial in class. In Maths, we continued to strengthen our understanding of working with challenging fractions and we solved a mystery using all manner of problem-solving skills. In English, we honed our inference skills when reading and we looked at classic detectives Sherlock Holmes and Poirot in our detective fiction unit. In Science, we drew diagrams of circuits and connected bulbs and motors in real circuits. In Art, we compared three landscape paintings looking at the various methods, subjects, purpose, textures and colours used. A very busy, fun week!
