# This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1

## PRESCHOOL



It was lovely to welcome the children back to Preschool this week. We began by reading 'Little Glow,' a story that highlights celebrations of light across different communities. Throughout the year, a small flame watches on as families use various kinds of light to celebrate Lunar New Year, Diwali, Hanukkah, Ramadan, Halloween, and Christmas. This gave us lots of opportunity to share our own experiences, using our speaking, and listening skills. The children have also enjoyed painting and decoupage on pumpkins, creating beautiful firework artwork and malleable play with the sparkly playdough.

## Reception



In Literacy this week, we have been learning 'Firework Poem' by James Carter. The children have performed the poem with actions. Have a look on Tapestry to watch our performances! In Maths, we have been exploring the properties and names of 2D shapes. In Understanding the World, we have been looking at signs of Autumn so we went on a local walk to explore the autumnal environment. The children loved exploring the outdoors, collecting natural items and jumping in the muddy puddles. In Art, the children are beginning to draw Autumn trees, making sure they are using the right colours for the leaves and smudging the chalk pastels to create different effects. In PE, we focused on different ways of travelling. We walked around like cows, stomped like giants and climbed like Jack from 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

## Year 1



In English, we have been reading bonfire night themed poems. We recited our whole class Firework Party poem with actions and thought of different verbs for our own poems that we will write next week. In Maths, we learnt about 2D and 3D shapes and the children really enjoyed making 3D shapes with playdoh. The boys and girls have enjoyed lots of Autumn activities linked to our Science unit. We've recorded the daily weather and temperatures, made autumn leaf wreaths and garlands, ripped up leaves to make a deciduous tree, made dens and autumn potions.

## YEAR TWO



Welcome back Year 2! This week in English, we have been reading Little Red Riding Hood as part of our new unit about fairy tales. We took part in role play activities and have started writing a diary entry about her day. In maths, we finished our addition and subtraction unit and we have started looking at 2D shape. In PSHE, we have been learning about who our special people are and how we are all different. On Thursday, we enjoyed an interesting visit from the Fire Service who talked to us about fire safety and taught us how to be safe on Bonfire night.

# This week in Key Stage 2

## YEAR THREE



In Art this week, we have been busy making our own cave pictures. We stuck paper to the underside of our tables and sat underneath (as if in a cave) we used pencils and chalks to draw the designs onto the paper. In Maths this week we have been focusing on subtracting three-digit numbers using the grid method. In Geography, we have started our new topic 'How does the ring of fire affect people?' we learnt why volcanic eruptions happen by firstly understanding the structure of the earth. What a fantastic week of learning Year 3!

## YEAR FOUR



Welcome to the new half term and our new class member Hassan. This week we started our new book *The Firework Makers Daughter* - one of my favourites! The children have explored the vocabulary in the text and build up a good picture of where the story is set and the characters. In Maths we have finished off our addition & subtraction unit and now the children can identify a range of appropriate methods to use including mental, jottings and column. In Science we have explored pitch and now the children can identify loud & quite and high & low sound waves. We have also begun testing with sound insulating.

## YEAR FIVE



What a busy, yet fun, week back at school. The children have begun their new topic all about Earth and space. Our literacy unit also ties in very closely with it as we are beginning to learn about sci-fi. We have also started to our art topic, finding out about the artist Damien Hirst and his colourful designs and patterns. I have been blown away with the effort the children have put into their research and creative ways of displaying what they have found out. A great start to this half term, well done Year 5!

## YEAR SIX



This week in English, Year 6 looked at the class text *Frankenstein* and used this to inspire their own spooky short stories. In Maths, we worked on our short and long multiplication written methods as well as trying (and succeeding!) in beating Mr Price in a game of Speed Maths. In Science, we explored what the circulatory system is in our bodies and examined a real sheep's heart...ewe! In History, we looked at the tragic yet inspirational life of Anne Frank, who went into hiding to avoid Nazi arrest. We were moved by one of Anne Frank's lines from her diary: "Think of all the beauty still left around you and be happy."
