This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1

PRESCHOOL



This week in Preschool we have been reading 'The Christmas Story' to help the children with their understanding of the Nativity. Reception



We have been reading the poem 'The Christmas Pine'. We explored the rhyming words in the poem and highlighted them. In Maths, we have been focusing on the number 9, gaining a deeper understanding of the number, what it means and where it is on a number line. We have been comparing the four seasons and exploring the different things we may see in each season. In PE, we focused on ball skills - throwing, catching and rolling. Also this week, we have been working amazingly hard at rehearsing our lines and songs for our Nativity! Year 1



This week in English, we have wrote our own dragon stories using the dragons from the story Zog. The children all worked really hard to produce some brilliant writing. In Maths, we are learning about volume and capacity and when containers are full, half full and empty. We then, measured the capacity of containers by pouring sand accurately and counting. In Art, we made our own firework sculptures using pipe cleaners and paper. In History, we learned about Samuel Pepys and his diary. We wrote our own diaries about what it was like in London during the fire. In DT, we started making our Tudor houses. Well done for another busy week Year One!

YEAR TWO



Year 2 have worked really hard on their Nativity again this week, keep it up! We have been learning how to use correct homophones in our writing in English and we practised using tally charts in maths. In Art, Year 2 created some wonderful winter scene pieces, inspired by the northern lights. We used our skills from our Lowry art unit last half-term, smudging charcoal, chalk and white pencils to create interesting effects - with a touch of glitter!

YEAR THREE



This week in Art, Year 3 have been busy creating their own winter birch scenes. We used watercolour paints and two other fun materials - masking tape and salt, to make beautiful winter wonderland artwork! In English, we finished writing our own Fables including dialogue, fronted adverbials and lots of connectives. I look forward to reading what the children have created. In Literacy we have started Explanation Text by watching Wallace & Gromit's Cracking Contraptions and orally explaining how their inventions work. We will also be moving on to 'time' soon so the more preparation they do at home the more confidence they will have when it comes to time lessons. We started our Egyptian history topic this week learning about pyramids and Gods. On Tuesday Year 4 will be walking over to Hulton House care home to make Christmas decorations.

YEAR FIVE



What a super week! The children really enjoyed the pantomime at the start of the week and have continued to work really hard in class. They have finally written their own Science-fiction stories and have done an amazing job of them. We have been exploring and investigating shadows in science and how they change over the course of a day. The children have also been creative designing and making collage winter scenes to be used in the art gallery - they have done a terrific job with them!! Swimming lessons start on Monday 4th December. We will be going every afternoon in school time, transport will be provided.

YEAR SIX



This week in English, we began writing a WW2-themed story about two boys who follow a downed Hurricane plane and inside they find a German pilot! What will they do? In Maths, we built 3-D shapes from their nets to counts vertices, edges and faces and we also began making our own 3D Tetris wall in class.
