# This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1




This week in Preschool has been an extremely creative one! The children have enjoyed lots of craft and art activities, making beautiful decorations for our classroom, as well as doing a superb job at decorating our class Christmas tree independently. We have been chatting about what makes this time of year special and asked, 'What is the best thing about Christmas time?' Our favourite answer was 'FAMILY!' Remember to book your tickets to our Nativity performance on Thursday 14th December, via the School Spider App or from the school office.



This week, we have been recapping lots of our sounds in Phonics. The children are getting to grips with digraphs now and they are beginning to spot them in every day words. In Literacy this week, we have been looking at 'The Christmas Story'. We sequenced the story using a story map and added to our 'Words of the Week' jar. In Maths, we have been focusing on the number 10, gaining a deeper understanding of the number, what it means and where it is on a number line. This week in Art, we have been drawing some winter trees using charcoal. The children have been practising our Nativity this week on the big stage and they have been working so hard. Well done children!







We have been working incredibly hard on their maths, reading and writing assessments. The children showed fantastic resilience all week and worked hard to solve tricky questions - well done! In maths, we have been learning about block graphs and pictograms. In English, we started looking at instruction texts and discussed what instructions we would use in our KS1 playground games. In RE, we learnt about the nativity story and why Jesus is important to Christians. Year 2 are looking forward to performing the nativity next week and they are so excited!

## This week in Key Stage 2



Year 3 have been working collaboratively - their task was to come up with a game they could play together using only two pieces of equipment. Their ideas have been fantastic! We had fun in French learning numbers and playing bingo! In Maths we have been looking at different ways to divide 2-digit numbers by 1 digit number. In English, the class have been planning their own fables using The Hare and Tortoise as a model. They found out lots of facts about their 2 chosen animals.



The children had a lovely time making decorations at the care home this week and speaking with a few residents. We have also begun learning the Christmas songs for the KS2 Christmas Concert and they should have come home with part of a poem to learn. Despite all the Christmassy goings on we have been finishing our explanation texts and continued to learn telling the time in Maths. We've also learnt about mummification with a rather messy experiment. Looking forward to time travelling to Ancient Egyptian next week - don't forget your things.



What a busy week it has been. Year 5 have shown amazing ambition this week whilst completing all of their work and assessments, they have really given 100% and I couldn't ask for more. We have also completed our first week of swimming lessons. This has proven to be another time to shine - all children have tried their best and made super progress already and many have overcome some of their own barriers and shown the 'Harris way' even when faced with a challenge. Well done, Year 5 - we am proud of you all! Reminder: Swimming lessons continue next Monday, 11<sup>th</sup> December for the final week.



Year 6 had their first ever look at SATs tests for English and Maths and their effort and positive attitudes made us all very proud. We can now focus on those areas we need to after Christmas in preparation for the actual SATs test in May. In English, we also looked at Charles Dickens and Ebenezer Scrooge. In Maths, we ended the week looking at different charts in statistics including tricky pie charts. In History, we began looking at how Preston was affected during WW2 and we focussed on Mr Fred Latham who was based at Nine Group Headquarters in Barton Hall, Preston. We were visited by our Neighbourhood Policing Team's PCSO, who told us how we can stay safe online and of the importance of our own personal
