This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1

PRESCHOOL



This week we returned to Preschool to find that a Pirate had been in our room and stollen all our dinosaurs! The cheeky pirate had left us a ransom note and a map we had to follow if we wanted our toys back. Teamwork, listening and communication skills were used to find the dinosaurs, as well map reading! We have had a go at making our own old treasure maps, using tea bags and water to stain the paper, before we marked our own route and 'X' marks the spot. We even had a go at singing, clapping, and stomping along to 'The Weller man' sea shanty!





In Literacy, we have been exploring vegetables and using our phonics skills to label them. In Maths, we have been comparing teen numbers using ten frames, mathematical language and estimation skills. In PE, we have been working on our balance for jumping, hopping and standing on one leg. We also had our first session with John from Didi Rugby, the children enjoyed showing off their fundamental movement skills and learning how to play Didi-rugby. In Understanding the World, we were looking at states of matter by carrying out puddle observations over the week.

Year 1



We have had a busy first week back and the children have been working hard. In English, we have been reading recounts about special family events and answering questions about what we have read. In Maths, we have been learning about multiplication by counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and creating arrays to solve problems. In Science, we have started to learn about materials and created a materials collage on the iPad which we labelled. In History, we learnt about toys our parents and grandparents played with. Well done Year 1 for a great first week back!






I hope you all had a lovely half-term break. In English this week, we have really enjoyed reading the story The Wind in the Willows. Year 2 created Wanted posters for Mr Toad and wrote some fantastic character descriptions using point and evidence. In maths, Year 2 practised recording measurements and solving real-life problems using centimetres and metres. In PSHE, we talked about how we can manage fallings out and what we can do when we are feeling big emotions. In RE, we started looking at the five pillars of Islam, focusing on the importance of prayer. We have also been learning the song Zootime in music. Keep up the brilliant work Year 2!

This week in Key Stage 2



Welcome back! Year 3 have settled back into their routines brilliantly. In English, we read the beginning of our book 'Iron Man' by Ted Hughes and explored similes. We created our own characters and read out our character descriptions to our partners; they then had to draw out what they imagined in their books. In Maths, we used a bar model to find fractions of a set of objects. In Science, we started our new topic 'Magnets and Forces' and explored push and pull. Well Done Year 3!



The class have been given their assembly parts this week and made a note of the colour T-shirt they need to bring on their script. Please help them to learn their lines at home. We are really looking forward to performing the play that the class have written themselves during the play script unit last term. In Maths we are dividing by chunking using known facts to help us. Keep practising times table facts at home to aid them. We have learnt about Jesus' temptation during his 40 days in the wilderness in RE and we have continued to practise numbers in French.



Year 5 have had a busy week this week getting to know their new theme and topics. They have been introduced to their focus text in English - Journey to the River Sea - which links in well with our topic of Amazon Adventures. The children have had a brain workout measuring, drawing and estimating angles and have really tried their best with this tricky area of maths! We have also begun to ask questions about rainforests for geography and started to explore our artist for this half term - Frida Kahlo.



Year 6 have had a great week back after half-term; we've had lots of smiles and lots of grafting - just the way we like it! In Maths, we boosted our knowledge of multiplying fractions and working on a range of place value reasoning questions. In English, we used prediction and inference to boost our reading skills as well as starting our new detective fiction topic. In Science, shockingly we began our new unit by investigating static electricity using balloons and in Geography we looked at maps of North America to locate know all 23 countries - ask a Y6 pupil how many they can remember!
