The Peri-ometer suggests the difficulty or challenge the homework may offer. Each week you should try include at least one task from the 'hot' or 'extra hot' spice level.

- Reading is a key part of your child's learning and it is essential you try to read at home as much as possible. There is now a new reading record in your child's reading pack that needs to be filled in every time you read. The new reading record does highlight when children aren't reading regularly at home and as a whole school this is being addressed weekly. Reading is vital!
- The new spellings for this half term will be in the homework books. They are a new set of spellings (use the set that your child is with for phonics) for your child to practice over the Autumn 2 term.
 Please start from week one and work across the 6 weeks. When the spellings have finished after 6 weeks we will be focusing on our nativity songs which I can send out nearer the time.
