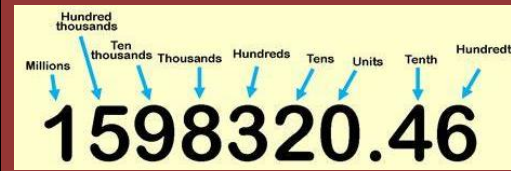
Research into the life of Isaac Newton and complete a fact-file about him and his theory of colour and light.

With adult help and support, plan and make a healthy snack (or meal) for your or your family to enjoy. Take photos of the process.



Write a haiku about the autumn. Haiku (3 line poem - 5,7,5 syllables)
Here is my example:

*Leaves are falling down
They crunch under my wet boots
I love to squish them!*

Can you recite the 4 Times Tables up to 200 whilst continually doing star jumps?

Extension challenge: do it in under 2 minutes!

Choose 4 sentences from your reading book that you consider to be very descriptive. Write each one out and explain the impact of each sentence.

Choose a character from your reading book. Write an extended response about the character's personality using quotes to support your points.

Write down 5 unknown words from your reading book and use a dictionary to write the definition.

Draw a 10 x 10 grid and write down the numbers 1 to 100 (or print one out).

Then, colour the Prime Numbers.

Sketch someone from your family. Ask them to sit down for 10 mins whilst you carefully draw them.

Play a game (board game, puzzle, quiz) with your family. Write down which game you played.

Practise times tables on TTRS for 10 minutes on at least three days this week.



Listen to 3 songs that you enjoy. Tell me all about them, who they are by, which one you enjoy the most and why!

Make four signs for rooms around school in French which can be put on the doors.
