SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

To ensure our school continues to provide an effective education for your children, we continually evaluate what we do and how well our pupils achieve.

As part of this process, we look for ways of doing things better or differently, to ensure we continue to provide the best education and care that we can. Our priorities for development may change as the needs and strengths of our school change.

Physically, we are gradually improving the learning environment and the school building, so that they are more inviting, motivating and purposeful for all children.

Each year, we decide on our main improvement priorities for the coming year.

This year our main priorities for development are:

QUALITY OF EDUCATION

To prioritise reading at all stages of school in terms of ethos, teaching, knowledge and skills so that all children have the opportunity to make expected or better progress.

Reading is the foundation to accessing all learning and information, so it is essential children can read well. We also strive for our children to have a thirst for and to have a life-long love of reading.

To ensure writing is taught using a consistent, phased approach to create imaginative and enthusiastic writers.

To be inspiring writers, children need to delve in to their imagination and feel confident in their ability. A consistent approach to teaching will facilitate this throughout their time at Harris Primary.

To ensure all foundations subjects have clarity and progression in their curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built upon, year on year.

To have high expectations for our children, we need to make sure that the curriculum is pitched at the correct level for each child across the school. We want children to learn, and know, more year and year.

BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES

To introduce and embed positive whole school strategies for behaviour, consistently, during all parts of the school day.

This is to ensure that we have high expectations of behaviour, attitudes and behaviour for learning and that they are met by the children.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

To develop and enhance our children's individual characters to help them take their place in modern Britain.

We strive for our children to develop personally, in terms of confidence, self-esteem and contribution to their locality and the World. This will be done through the living of our school values.

LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

To fully implement and embed Harris Primary School's new vision and values.

A clear and consistent ethos is needed to drive everything that takes place in school; from how children are taught to the way all members of school interact with each other.

To develop Middle Leaders so that they drive improvements, across school, through their subject leadership roles.

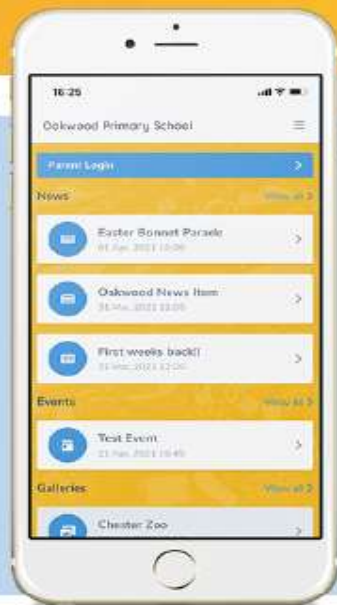

Dear Parents,

Places are now available to join a new 12-week football course every Saturday at Preston College, which is open to both boys and girls.

Our courses teach children correct football techniques by FA qualified coaches who have full DBS (CRB) clearance to work with children. The structure for the course is 'FUN through Football,' building confidence for total beginners and moving onto more complex sessions for experienced players.

We provide a ball per player for the majority of our drills ensuring children get more touches of the ball and improve quicker than conventional coaching where children are waiting around to have a turn. The sessions are held in the fantastic sports hall so trainers should be worn. Players are also advised to bring a still drink for the session.

The club has links to local junior teams of which players will be able to play for at the weekend. Players who show advanced ability on the course will be recommended for trials at professional academies. Players who have previously attended courses are currently playing for Blackburn Rovers, Preston North End, Manchester United, Liverpool, Blackpool, Everton, Burnley, Bolton, Oldham, Rochdale and Wigan.

The cost of the course is just £5.50 per week, which is payable in two instalments. The first payment of £25 is due when booking your child on and the second payment of £40 due at the first session. Parents are encouraged to watch the sessions but are welcome to leave children, as every session is fully supervised.

****NEW TOURNAMENT FORMAT****

Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.

ALL PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE A TROPHY at the presentation, which is held on the final week of the course. Additional trophies will also be awarded in each group from categories including; Best Attitude, Star Player, Most Improved Player, Most Promising Player and Hardest Working Player.
